Dear Westminster Church Family,

Whoooo... it is hot out there. I hope that you are able to stay cool. My post Covid-health is much improved. Thanks for your prayers. I'm feeling a bit more like myself each day.

Your Session had a retreat last weekend to discern our direction for the next twelve months (September 2023 to August 2024). Among the matters discussed was College Hill.

As a matter of orientation and history, WPC was formed to serve the College Hill neighborhood. The neighborhood has changed, to be sure, but our charge remains the same. So, our session has directed us to continue to focus on College Hill. In particular, we need to look for ways to partner with College Hill residents in meeting needs in this community. That means we need to stay in close contact with the College Hill community, participate in what their leaders plan, and consider their plans as we make ours. We will have a representative on the College Hill Neighborhood Association board who reports directly to the session. We will find ways to let the community know that we want them to participate in our ministry efforts. To that end, we are going to create several "come help" lawn signs and promotion pieces. These will be designed to let the community know about our ministry efforts and invite them to participate. Relationships will be advanced and the community will grow in their awareness of what difference WPC makes in the neighborhood. In short, our focus on College Hill is a long term strategy that will continue to morph and adapt as the need arises.

#### WPC was formed to serve College Hill.

It may not be obvious, so forgive me for pointing it out. By reminding ourselves that WPC was formed to serve College Hill, we are saying that WPC was not formed to serve itself. The word "ecclesia", often translated as "church" always refers to a gathered community of faith, not the building. That does not mean that the our building is not important. It is a place of many important memories. But we are not here to serve ourselves. We must take care of each other, love each other, support each other but never forget that we are here to serve College Hill. The gravitational force of a local congregation is always inward. By this, I mean that since those in the community (who do not attend church) are not present at church gatherings to advocate for their needs, churches often forget the community. So it takes an intentional, purposeful effort to serve the community.

Jesus sent his followers to be his witnesses. They were to start in Jerusalem... where they were located, their immediate neighborhood so to speak (Acts 1:8). College Hill is our Jerusalem. Of course we care about the larger community, regional mission and international efforts for the kingdom of God, but our focus is College Hill. Thank you for all you have done and continue to do in ministry through WPC. Keep up the good work. Your labor is not in vain. Lives are being touched.

## Clerk's Council

I would like to point out to you a couple of things happening that are not on the church calendar. First, thanks to Charlotte Bates' devotion and hard work, we will soon have a new Church Directory. A lot has changed since the last update more than a year ago. The task is not as easy as it would seem, and we owe Charlotte our appreciation and gratitude for voluntarily taking on this project.

The other thing I want to mention is a change that may have been noticed by those who read posted Session meeting minutes (in the purple binder in the church library). Our past practice has been to post minutes only after Session approval. This typically takes weeks to happen as minutes are not presented to Session for approval until the next stated (regularly scheduled) meeting. In an effort to improve transparency and with a suggestion from Bob Frasier, Stated Clerk at PNKS, drafted Session minutes will now be watermarked as "DRAFT" and posted before Session approval. This will usually occur within a few days after a Session meeting. The drafted minutes will be replaced with approved minutes shortly after they have been approved. Approved minutes will bear no watermark. You will want to remember that if you are reading Session minutes marked "DRAFT" there may be some differences in the final, approved document.

Members may be interested to know that Session met Saturday, July 22, for a planning retreat in the Community Room at Brewster Place. They worked hard to determine WPC's next steps with College Hill involvement, recommendations from the 2020 Holy Cow Report and our church focus for the next 12 months (starting in September). You will undoubtedly be hearing details along these lines in the near future. Until then, stay cool and keep up the good work Living God's Love.

If you are struggling with your loss, want to gain a better understanding of your grief, and would like a safe space to travel that journey with others, we encourage you to consider




## Presbyterian Women Kickoff - August 30, 5:30 pm


