Beloved in Christ,

On this Palm Sunday, I write in the shadow of the cross, knowing that Jesus was not a victim taken by surprise in Jerusalem. Jesus knew what awaited him in Jerusalem, and he went there for us all. And through the shame and weakness of the Roman cross, God has brought all of creation new life. We are lifted out of the kingdom of darkness into God's marvelous kingdom of light. May God be praised!!

As you know, we have three essential practices as a Congregation at Westminster Presbyterian Church: Praying, Serving and Connecting. What if we spent a month focusing on each of our essential practices each year? Since our daily prayer is called the 430 Prayer and we usually celebrate the Prayer Festival on April 30th, (4:30), it makes sense to focus on praying in April. So, let's focus on praying in April.



During this Lent, our congregation joined two sister churches in an experiment of prayer and community. Using the book, "Unbinding Your Soul" by Martha Grace Reese, we focused on just the first part of the book. I suggest we spend April focusing on the second part of the book. The most important components of this prayer journey are using a prayer journal, being in prayer partnership with one other person from our congregation and participating in a small group in which new ideas about prayer can be explored in a safe and confidential environment. How does that sound to you? I pray you will say "yes" to this invitation. Books are available in the church office. Pick one up as soon as you can and do the required reading before our first group meeting. Please read following sections:

Introduction

Chapter 9, Using Your Prayer Journal

Chapter 5, From Passengers to Riders.

There are several groups already in place that will participate in this study (more information forthcoming). In addition, I'm starting a brand-new group for just the month of April. That group will meet in the Parlor on Wednesday nights (April 3rd, 10th, 17th and 24th), 6:30 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. I encourage you to join a group for this study.

CLERK'S CORNER

RECORDS REVIEW:

I am happy to report that Westminster Presbyterian Church passed the Annual Records Review of 2023 Records without exception on Saturday, March 16, 2024. Clerks of Session from 10 PNK churches lugged their heavy record books to Auburn Presbyterian Church where they were presented for scrutiny and evaluation by their peers.

The Annual Records Review is the means by which Presbytery of Northern Kansas ensures that individual churches conduct church business on an ongoing and timely basis over the course of a year. While there is some consideration of the Clerk's approach to writing minutes and documenting Session actions, the ultimate focus of the review is on Session activity that supports church activity and health.

A two-page checklist of actions to be taken by each Session "guides" the
 review and includes such actions as completion of required reports, budget
 preparation and adoption, scheduling communion service and congregational meetings, and reviews of specific policies and the church membership roll.

That WPC records were passed without exception (Far fewer than half of the churches in PNK pass review at that level.) is testament to the work and commitment of your Session to support our church in its mission. Our Elders (Charlotte Adair, Charlie Bates, Matt Boddington, Sue Fackler, Janice Kivett and Peter Bonnel) deserve our thanks for their dedicated service to Westminster Presbyterian Church!


TERMS OF CALL FOLLOW-UP:

Graduate Recognition


