Since ancient times, builders have used cornerstones in their construction projects. A cornerstone was the principal stone, usually placed at the corner of an edifice, to guide the workers in their course. The cornerstone was usually one of the largest, the most solid, and the most carefully constructed of any in the edifice. The Bible describes Jesus as the cornerstone that His church would be built upon. He is foundational. Once the cornerstone was set, it became the basis for determining every measurement in the remaining construction; everything was aligned to it.

As the cornerstone of the building of the church, Jesus is our standard of measure and alignment. Please join us, Sunday, May 4th, as we recognize with celebration & rededication the 100th anniversary of the laying of the cornerstone at Westminster, remembering Jesus as our standard of measure and alignment in our lives.


WE WILL GET TOGETHER FOR SOME FUN AND FELLOWSHIP AT SKINNY'S BAR AND GRILL.




